Catherine McAuley members exemplify the spirit of mercy by participation in community outreach projects in service to the poor. Each week an assigned team of club members prepares bag lunches to be delivered for distribution by the Beth-El Shelter in Milford. Each member pays \$15 at the beginning of the year for food/supplies and is scheduled several times each year to prepare lunches. In the past four years the Lauralton Humanities Club has produced over 3400 bag lunches. In addition to preparing the lunches, Humanities Club members make contributions to the Beth-el Shelter larder by donating designated staple items each week.

The club also supports Invisible Children, a movement dedicated to ending the longest running war in Africa in which children are being forced to fight against the government in a rebel army. Humanities Club organizes events to raise funds to help the war-torn kids.

In collaboration with students and staff, we perform acts of Campus Ministry planning retreats, liturgies and prayer services for both students and staff. Students assist in preparation of liturgies and selection of music, and also participate as altar

servers, ministers of the Word and lectors.

The Science Club is a combination of a Science Olympiad Club and a STEAM Club. You may join 1 section of the club, or both! The STEAM section is a fun club that will conduct many fun scientific experiments and activities. The club will meet once or twice a month to explore scientific concepts, real-world problems and engineering challenges, This sections will also participate in Science Olympics (outreaching to the community).

Science Olympiad section would be a group of students who are interested in science, and wish to learn more about science, experience more and compete against other schools. There are 23 different topics/events at the CT Science Olympiad, from anatomy, forensics, chemistry lab, to astronomy, geology, physics and so on. Preparation would begin in September for the Olympiad, which takes place in April. We also wish to attend invitationals of Science Olympiad such as M.I.T., Harvard, or Yale Invitationals during the school year. We need a minimum of participants interested to participate in the Olympiad. (Each member can participate in one or more events in the Olympiad). This section of the club would have to meet very often (approx once per week, more as the Olympiad approaches).

The Stock Market Club was formed so that students might participate in the Stock Market Game. Students form teams consisting of three to five players. The team begins the game with a credit of \$100,000 which they use to "invest" in the New York, American or NASDAQ Stock Markets. They can buy, sell, buy on margin, or sell stocks short. They are charged commissions and interest exactly as if they were trading in the real market. At the end of the year, the team whose stocks are worth the most money is declared the winner.

The purpose of the game is to have fun while learning the mechanics of investing in the Stock Market. The game accurately simulates investment opportunities available in the stock market and allows students to experiment with options they might not ordinarily use when real money was at stake.
