Lauralton Hall was established in 1905 and is owned and sponsored by the Sisters of Mercy. It is a Catholic, independent college preparatory school open to young women who are seeking a challenging high school program. Admission is gained by examination, strong past academic performance and standardized test scores as well as by recommendation. Located in the center of Milford, Connecticut on a spacious campus, Lauralton Hall serves approximately 368 students, grades 9 through 12 from both New Haven and Fairfield counties.

All faculty hold a Bachelor's degree with 85% holding advanced degrees.

On March 10, 2020 we closed campus due to potential exposure to COVID-19.

The next day, online learning was in full operation—classes conducted by video conference following our regular daily schedule for the remainder of the school year. Six years of practice during inclement weather closings, skilled faculty, technology, motivated students and supportive parents allowed us to make such a move seamlessly.

Placement in Honors and AP courses is based solely upon grade criteria. Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Computer Science, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Environmental Science, European History, French Language and Culture, Latin Vergil, Physics I, Psychology, Spanish Language, U.S. History

While students may apply for a waiver to enroll in 4 AP classes, students are generally limited to taking 3 AP classes per Academic Year.
